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







Climate and monthly weather conditions

Nurimaru APEC House

누리마루APEC하우스

The Nurimaru APEC House was originally created to host the 13th Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Summit in 2005. The name is a combination of two Korean words, *nuri* (literally, "the world"), and *maru* (literally, a "summit" or "zenith"), and denotes "a house where the leaders of the world gather together." Surrounded by a magnificent forest of camellia and pine trees, the three-story structure captures a creative take on the traditional Korean architectural style of jeongja, or wooden pavilion. This unique site is becoming popular for hosting VIP banquets and dinners. The panoramic view of the adjacent sea and the Gwangan-daegyo Bridge make it a popular destination for individual and group tourists alike. The building also offers diverse amenities, including various event rooms and conference halls.









Busan Cinema Center

영화의전당

The Busan Cinema Center, where the annual Busan International Film Festival starts and which is on the Guinness book of world records for having the longest roof in the world, is a central place of public celebrations and special events. It is also decorated with 42,600 LED light bulbs.

The Bay 101

더베이101

The Bay 101 is one of the hottest destinations in Busan today. It provides a breathtaking view of the surrounding Marine City at night and is equipped with amenities necessary for organizing quality events. It offers access to yachts, semi-submarines, and other marine sports, while the walking-trail behind it offers a leisurely stroll along the neighboring Dongbaek-seom Island.

Busan Museum Culture Center

The Apparel Culture Center provides Joseon-period traditional garments for rent, including the robes for kings and court officials, archery uniforms, women's gowns, palatial garments and wedding gowns, free of charge.

Allak Seowon **Confucian Academy at** Chungnyeol-sa Temple

The Allak Seowon Confucian Academy and its education division provides 15 free-ofcharge programs on Korean traditions and customs, including traditional etiquette, folk games, tea ceremony, and traditional vocal art.



Geumjeong Sanseong Village

금정산성마을

The village has long been renowned for the quality of the yeast and makgeolli it produces. The Sanseong Makgeolli Making Program, in which participants make traditional undistilled Korean rice wine using yeast and steamed rice, is open to the public all year round.







Tteule-jang

This special place of traditional Korean culinary culture, certified by the Busan Metropolitan Government, offers a wide array of Korean food, including fermented pastes, kimchi, rice cakes, and soft bean curds, both for tasting and making. Tteule-jang seats up to 30 persons at once.

Eomuk (fish cake) tasting

Samjin Eomuk, the oldest of all fish cake manufacturers in Korea, and Goraesa Eomuk, located in Bujeon Market, invite guests to try making fish cakes of their own. Participants can mold the fish paste dough into the shapes they want, deep-fry them in oil and taste them.



Traditional Dance

Dongnaehak Chum (Crane Dance)

At Yihwa Pungnyu Culture Center, guests can enjoy learning the basics of the famed *dongnaehak chum* ("crane dance") performed while wearing the proper traditional costumes. The program admits up to 30 persons.







Temple Stay

Heungbeob-sa Temple Stay

홍법사 템플스테이

The temple stay program here includes Zen meditation in nature, as well as special activities on Korean traditions and customs (themes change every month), such as making rice cakes, *yutnori* (Korean folk game), making kimchi, making kites, and making *hwajeon* (pancakes with flowers).



범어사 템플라이프

This program acquaints guests with diverse aspects of life at a Buddhist monastery, including *barugongyang* (eating meals), tea ceremony, and Buddhist exercises. Additional classes on making yeomju (Buddhist rosaries) and paper lotus flowers are also available. Capacity: 40 persons.

Queen's Banquet

A theater exclusively dedicated to *Queen's Banquet*, a production by the Busan National Gugak (traditional music) Center, is located at the Haeundae Grand Hotel. The plot involves a queen, born after a nationwide ritual for national peace and prosperity, who throws a major banquet for the people. The tickets are sold out for almost every showing, so book yours in advance!



Centum Marina Park

센텀 마리나파크

A wide range of marine activity and sports equipment, including yachts, SOL 10, aquabikes, Hobie kayaks, bumper cars, windmill boats, and duck boats are available here.

Gadeok-do Lighthouse Program

가덕도 등대 생활 체험

The dormitory by this old lighthouse on Gadeok Island is open to the public so that guests can reenact the lifestyle of lighthouse guards. The program includes gauging water temperatures, observing the weather, and lighting the lighthouse's beacon.

Blue Marine Yacht

블루마린

This yacht program run by The Bay 101 is divided into four tour courses: public, sunset, luxury, and exciting tours. Guests can enjoy barbecue parties and other such activities at the clubhouse on the dock.

Nakdong-gang River Eco Tour Ferry

Sail along the Nakdong River, the largest wintering site for migratory birds in Asia, while enjoying the breathtaking view of the sunset, the reed flowers, and flocks of birds.



Sightseeing Destinations



Haeundae Beach

해운대해수욕장

An iconic symbol of seaside landscapes and romance in Busan and all of Korea, Haeundae Beach is located quite close to the heart of an urban center and is lined with luxury hotels and trendy restaurants and bars. Also equipped with hot spring and entertainment facilities, Haeundae Beach hosts diverse festivals and bustles with large crowds all year round.

Gwangalli Beach

광안리해수욕장

This stretch of sand backed by restaurants and nightclubs boasts a scenic nightscape, made fantastic by the Gwangan-daegyo Bridge that stretches across the sea. The diverse-themed streets and alleyways around Gwangalli Beach host festivals and performances all year round, while the charming cafes and bars also attract visitors from everywhere.

Dadaepo Beach

다대포해수욕장

Dadaepo Beach is especially popular among family vacationers for its wide and shallow sea. The flaming sunset over Dadaepo is one of the most memorable sights of Busan.

Songdo Beach

송도해수욕장

The first public beach to go into business in Korea, Songdo Beach boasts a magnificent littoral landscape, which has led it to be nicknamed "the Naples of East Asia." The sea nearby features an enormous whale-shaped lighthouse, diverse lighting works, and a fountain that together create a fantastical nightscape.

Songjeong Beach

송정해수욕장

This tranquil spot for relaxation features a lush green pine forest and a crystal-clear sea. The beach draws large crowds with its festivals, dalmaji ("moon-welcoming") events, and surfing opportunities.

Ilgwang Beach

일광해수욕장

The horizon of Ilgwang Beach extends to the neighboring fishing villages. Tourists can also arrive here by train from downtown Busan via Donghae-Nambu Train Line. The beach draws many families and couples.

Imnang Beach

임랑해수욕장

Imnang Beach features a vast field of sand that extends well over one kilometer in length. Numerous old pine trees form a natural screen in the back of the beach. Nearby is Jangansa Temple, one of the four major centers of Buddhism in Gijang District.







Gwangan-daegyo Bridge

광안대교

This long, high and curving bridge is one of the most famous landmarks of Busan. Nicknamed "the diamond bridge," Gwangan-daegyo provides an optimal point from which tourists can view the other famous features of Busan, including Oryukdo Island, Dongbaek-seom Island, and Dalmaji Hill. The bridge also features the world's largest-scale LED light works and music equipment for night shows.

Gwangan-daegyo Bridge

Hwangnyeong-san Observatory

A perfect place for viewing the lavish fireworks of the Busan Fireworks Festival, Hwangnyeong-san Mountain features an observatory on the ground and a food court below the ground. Enjoy a cup of hot tea while taking in the amazing view of downtown Busan at nighttime.

Marine City

마린시티

Often likened to "the Hong Kong of Korea," the Marine City features skyscrapers of inestimable heights, shops of diverse brands and styles, and a beautiful cruise floating on the sea. The lights emitted by all these features keep the horizon bright even at night. The Marine City is also the best place where tourists can enjoy the best views of the adjacent Suyeongman Yacht Stadium.



Igidae Park

이기대 도시자연공원

Famous as a perfect spot for viewing the magnificent sea cliffs nearby, Igidae Park draws in tourists who want to admire natural scenery in tranquility and peace.

Haedong Yonggung-sa Temple

해동용궁사

Located at the southern end of Korea's East Coast, Haedong Yonggung-sa Temple is famous for the legend that any woman who touches the belly of the Pu Tai statue at the entry of the temple's 108 Steps will bear a son. Unlike other Buddhist temples that are located deep in the mountains, Haedong Yonggung-sa is situated on a spot that provides a clear view of the indigo-blue East Sea of Korea.

Samnak Riverside Sports Park

삼락생태공원

The huge canola flower field, sprawling over some 57,000 square meters in area, is bright with its characteristic vivid yellow even when seen from afar. The park becomes an ideal photo spot in March and April, with the backdrop of the endless rows of canola blossoms.

Dongbaek-seom Island

동백섬

This is a refreshing green space, shaded by lush camellia and pine tree forests, that is found at the southern end of Haeundae Beach. Enjoy a leisurely stroll along the wooden decked trail that surrounds the island and you will encounter Haeundae Beach, whose beauty reaches its peak at sunset.



Taejong-dae

태종대

Located at the southernmost tip of the Yeongdo beach, Taejong-dae got its name from the historic fact that King Taejong Muyeol-wang of Silla used to visit here often, admiring its magnificent coastal landscape. On fair-weather days, tourists can even view Tsushima Island.



Gamcheon Culture Village

감천문화마을

Originally created as a ghetto of Korean War refugees in the 1950s, Gamcheon Culture Village features endless rows of houses, all of similar shapes and sizes, on a staircase-like plane on one side of a mountain. The alleyways form a gigantic maze. Nicknamed "the Machu Picchu of Busan," the village draws large numbers of visitors all year round because of its unique scenery.



Beomeo-sa Temple

범어사

Created by Great Monk Uisang under the reign of King Munmu-wang of Silla, the "Dharma-Fish Monastery" was created as one of the three major temples of the Yeongnam Region, along with Haein-sa and Tongdo-sa Temples. The origin legend has it that Master Uisang saw a vision of a golden carp descending from heaven into a golden well on the summit of Mt. Geumjeongsan, inspiring him to site this great temple on its northeastern slopes



Taejong-dae Hot Spring Spa

태종대온천

Located nearby Taejong-dae, famous for its scenic beauty, the Taejong-dae Hot Spring Spa features a broad array of natural hot spa baths and saunas, including the Health Tub, the Loess Sauna, the Wet Germanium Sauna, the Charcoal Sauna, the Pyramid Tub, and the Outdoor Tub, all of which serve to refresh guests and promote their health. The spa can be reached in just three minutes on foot from the gravel walkway of Taejong-dae Park. After relaxing in the spa, you can walk across the yard to enjoy delectable grilled clams amid the sound of the waves.



Shinsegae Spa Land

신세계 스파랜드

Shinsegae Spa Land provides natural hot water, rich in alkaline sodium bicarbonate, drawn from 1,000 meters below the ground. The facility features diverse saunas modeled after those found worldwide, including Finnish, ancient Roman, and Turkish saunas. The spa also includes an outdoor bath for women only, as well as an entertainment zone for relaxation and aesthetic treatments.



Dongnae Hot Spring Spa

동래온천

Dongnae has been famous as a center of natural hot springs since the Silla period. The weak alkaline hot spring water in this area is rich with magnesium and chloride ions that are said to cure neurological, skin, gastrointestinal, and obstetric diseases. The mild hot spring water here is also suited to seniors, young children, and patients in recovery. Cast away your travel fatigue with hot springs in Dongnae. Afterwards, you can tour the destinations nearby, including Mt. Geumjeong-san, Geumgang Park, the Botanical Garden, Beomeo-sa Temple, the Busan Folklore Arts Center, and the Busan Marine Natural History Museum.



Haeundae Spa

해운대온천센터

The one and only hot spring spa on a beach, Haeundae Spa is especially famous for its saline solution baths, ranging in temperature from 40 to 62°C, which are said to dramatically improve the skin condition. These potable solutions also have a diuretic effect, and can help improve rheumatism, blood circulation, and diabetes.





Busan International Film Festival (held mid-October every year)

The dynamic landscapes and scenes of Busan have long been beloved backdrops and subjects of Korean cineastes irrespective of genres. Every fall Busan welcomes the arrival of its major international film festival, featuring movies and cineastes from all around the world.

Busan Christmas-tree Festival (held from November to January)

Gwangbok-ro, a major street extending across central downtown Busan, is brightly lit with Christmas lights and brimming with carols toward the end of every year. A gigantic Christmas tree made of light bulbs brightens our spirits when the night falls. Christmas trees of all shapes and sizes are lined up along the streets in this area, welcoming families and couples in love. Various events and activities, including illumination shows, performances, and arts-and-crafts classes, are also available

Keeping the Night Sky Over Busan Bright and Fantastical

Busan Fireworks Festival

(held mid-October every year)

When the leaves of trees begin to change colors in Busan, magnificent fireworks are set off over Busan's sparkling sea. The Busan Fireworks Festival marks the height of fall with its lavish fireworks against the backdrop of the Gwangan-daegyo Bridge and an open vast sea.

Haeundae Sand Festival (held every May)

Shopping





Shinsegae Simon Premium Outlet

신세계 사이먼 프리미엄 아울렛

This outlet features approximately 180 of the most popular fashion brands from around the world, such as Armani and Marc Jacobs, as well as some of the most renowned domestic brands, including Kuho and Objet. This may be an outlet where one can purchase out-of-season brand-name goods at affordable prices, but the atmosphere is as luxurious as at any of the major department stores worldwide.

Lotte Premium Outlet (East Busan)

롯데프리미엄 아울렛 동부산점

A multiplex of shopping, culture, and the arts, the entire outlet design was inspired by the romantic scenery of Santorini, Greece. The outlet features a fountain square, a lighthouse observatory, and a rose garde

Jangyu Lotte Outlet

장유롯데아울렛

An ultimate destination for a shopping spree, this outlet offers not only brandname shops for clothing, but also venues for fashion accessories and a food court. There is also a multiplex Lotte Cinema in the New Building part of the outlet. The nearby Lotte Water Park bustles with large crowds throughout the summer.

Shinsegae Department Store at Centum City

신세계백화점 센텀시티점

This department store was included in the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest department store in the world in 2009, and has maintained that record ever since. This is a megacomplex of shopping and leisure, complete with a wide range of amenities, including a spa land, an ice rink, a sky park, and even a multiplex cinema (CGV).

Lotte Department Stores

롯데백화점

There are four Lotte Department Stores in Busan today, including the first and the largest in Centum City, as well as the original Busan store, the Dongnae store, and the Gwangbok store. Each Lotte Department Store also houses a multiplex (Lotte Cinema).







Hyundai Department Store

현대백화점

The one and only Hyundai Department Store in Busan is found on Beomil-ro in Dong-gu. The massive building with nine stories above the ground is equipped with various convenient amenities for customers, including a lounge for breastfeeding mothers and a host of cafes. Neighboring the store are the Busan Jayu Wholesale Market and the Jewelry Mall.

Jagalchi and Gukje Markets

자갈치시장, 국제시장

Jagalchi and Gukje Markets are iconic features of commerce and history in Busan. They bustle with the lively energy and passion of Busan's citizens. Famous for its slogan, "Oiso, boiso, saiso" ("Come, see, and buy"), Jagalchi Market is the largest seafood venue in Korea. Gukje Market, made immortal by a recent theater hit bearing the same title, also draws large crowds with its wide range of merchandise.

Gwangbok Fashion Town

광복동패션거리

Gwangbok Fashion Town, extending from the starting point of Gwangbokro to the entrance to Gukje Market via the Busan Modern History Museum in Daecheong-dong, was the leader of fashion trends in Korea until the 1970s, introducing the latest trends in Japanese fashion. Starting with a department store standing at the entry to Gwangbok-ro, hundreds of fashion shops and cafes throng both sides of the two-lane road.

Lotte, Shinsegae, and Gimhae Airport Duty-Free Shops

Stop by these little paradises for travelers at Lotte and Shinsegae Department Stores as well as Gimhae International Airport.

Seomyeon Underground Mall (Daehyeon Free Mall)

Daehyeon Free Mall Busan, found underground in the central-downtown Seomyeon district, houses some 570 shops in total. This is a perfect place for shopping for women's clothes, cosmetic products, and fashion accessories for young people.

Delicacies of Busan



Ssiat-hotteok

씨앗호떡

Ssiat-hotteok is perhaps the most popular of all street foods in Busan. These oil-fried pancakes with sweet nut mixtures cooked-in are rich in anti-oxidants and vitamins that are good for the skin and health. Nutritious and delectable, these pancakes have a history of well over five decades and make perfect snacks.

Doeji-gukbap

돼지국밥

Doeji-gukbap, made with a deeply flavorful broth obtained after hours of boiling pig bones and pork, represents the soul of Busan and South Gyeongsang Province. Make a comforting meal by mixing the white broth with a chili pepper mixture, fermented shrimp paste, and crisp chive salad.

Busan Milmyeon

부산밀면

The perfectly chewy milmyeon (wheat noodles) provide a great and affordable snack for everyone. Mixed with ice cubes, *Busan milmyeon* becomes all the more delicious in summer.

Dongnae Pajeon

동래파전

Dongnae pajeon, filled with fresh seafood and vegetables, is a nutritious and delicious snack and accompaniment to drinks. This style of Korean scallion pancakes has been popular for well over a century and has become an iconic symbol of the Dongnae district of Busan.

Busan Eomuk

부산어묵

Eomuk, or fish cakes, refer to ground fish meat seasoned and deep-fried in oil. Busan is famous for its diverse brands and styles of fish cakes. Samjin Eomuk and Goraesa, both fish cake companies based in Busan, have become household names nationwide today. These and other local companies produce a host of diverse fish cakes mixed with cheese, bacon, and non-fish seafood.

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
